Team Description -- Are you a behind-the-scenes enthusiast with a passion for making events run seamlessly? Join our site ops Team and be a vital part of the crew that brings the festival to life. From setting the stage to managing the sound and lights, your skills will help create unforgettable moments for festival-goers.??

Expectations

The site operations team is there to support other teams on site at Limitless Festival, ensuring that everything's in place and working to bring the event together. The team is responsible for setting up and packing down all infrastructure needed for the event as well as being on hand during the event to keep things in order and to troubleshoot should any issues arise.

Roles & Responsibilities

Pre and Post event you'll be setting up and packing down the event, this means everything from unloading containers and moving pallets of supplies, to more creative and detailed tasks like setting up venue décor. Pack Down is much the same in reverse as the site has to be returned to its original condition before we leave. These will be long days, but certainly rewarding, with a great community feel to the team.

During the event the team is split into either AM or PM teams, which will be approximately 8 hours each day. This will consist of checking the venues, replenishing gas supplies, fixing things around the site supporting the tech team, helping to set up fencing and barriers and infrastructure for the Big Ones which happen daily in the showring. Towards the end of the event, you'll be helping to pack everything down and get the showground back to the condition it was in before the events.

In addition to your specific roles all team members are asked to take responsibility for the wellbeing and safety of young people and follow emergency protocols as needed.

Hours – You will need to arrive on site on Friday 2nd Aug at midday then all leave on Thursday 8th after pack down.

Minimum Age: 18

DBS Required: Yes

Reference: Every volunteer is required to have had a reference by someone who has had leadership responsibility for them for at least a year. This ideally needs to be a church leader, youth worker but also can be a work manager or teacher.

ANYTHING ELSE I SHOULD KNOW?

The team consists of a community of brilliant people from various walks of life, some people that have been helping run events for decades, these people are always happy help new team members learn the ropes!

You'll need to bring some mid-soled shoes or steel toe capped boots with you and we would also suggest you bring a waterproof jacket with you as you'll be working outside, come rain or shine! You don't need any specific experience to join the production team but you will need to be physically fit enough for long days on your feet and some heavy lifting. You'll need some common sense and a can do attitude to get you and the rest of the team through the event!
